International Lefthanders Day

August 13, 2026

Left-Handers Day History

On 13th August 1992 the Club launched International Left-Handers Day, an annual event when left-handers everywhere can celebrate and increase public awareness of the advantages and disadvantages of being left-handed. This event is now celebrated worldwide, and in the U.K. alone there have been more than 20 regional events to mark the day in recent years – including left-v-right sports matches, a left-handed tea party, pubs using left-handed corkscrews where patrons drank and played pub games with the left hand only, and nationwide “Lefty Zones” where left-handers creativity, adaptability and sporting prowess were celebrated, while right-handers were encouraged to try out every day left-handed objects to see just how awkward it can feel using the wrong equipment!

These events have contributed more than anything else to the general awareness of the difficulties and frustrations left-handers experience in everyday life and have successfully led to improved product design and greater consideration of our needs by the right-handed majority – although there is still a long way to go!!

Donate Instead: If your neighbors are already zucchini'd-out, consider donating your surplus to a local hunger relief organization or community food bank.

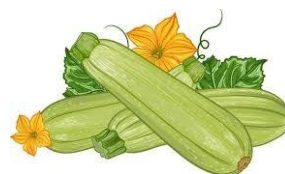
Mike's Zucchini Bread

Ingredients

3 cups all-purpose flour – spoon leveled
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
3 large eggs
1 cup avocado oil – you can use veg. oil
1 cup sugar
1 cup brown sugar
3 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
2 cups unpeeled grated zucchini – **I tend to use around 3 cups as I like it very moist**
1 cup chopped walnuts (optional) **I don't!**

Directions

1. Grease and flour two 8 x 4-inch pans. **I use Pam Baking Spray** Preheat oven to 325
2. Sift flour, salt, baking powder, soda, and cinnamon together in a bowl.
3. Beat eggs, oil, vanilla, and sugar together in a large bowl. Add sifted ingredients to the creamed mixture and beat well. Stir in zucchini and nuts until well combined. Pour batter into prepared pans.
4. Bake for 40 to 60 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool in pan on rack for 20 minutes. Remove bread from pan, and cool completely.



August is a powerhouse month for world history. From political milestones to cultural changes and major scientific discoveries, here are some significant events that happened during this month.

August 1, 1834: Slavery was abolished throughout the British Empire.

August 1, 1981: MTV (*Music Television*) was launched, fundamentally changing the landscape of popular music and broadcasting.

August 4, 1961: Barack Obama, the first African American president in United States history, was born.

August 6, 1945: The first atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan, dramatically altering the course of World War II.

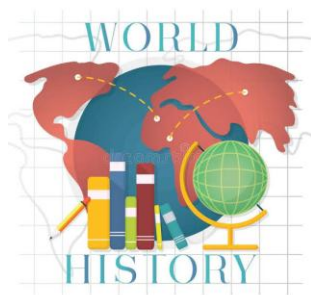
August 6, 1965: President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act into law, a landmark victory for the Civil Rights Movement.

August 6, 1991: Tim Berners-Lee introduced the World Wide Web to the public.

August 18, 1920: The 19th Amendment was ratified, officially guaranteeing American women the right to vote.

August 21, 1959: Hawaii officially became the 50th state to join the United States.

August 28, 1963: Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his legendary "*I Have a Dream*" speech during the March on Washington.



August is an incredibly monumental month for music as well. From era-defining album releases and legendary live performances to cultural changes and the debuts of iconic music festivals, the month is packed with milestones across almost every genre.

August 15–18, 1969: The **Woodstock Music & Art Fair** took place in Bethel, New York. It featured iconic performances by Jimi Hendrix, Santana, and The Who, becoming the defining cultural moment of a generation.

August 29, 1966: The **Beatles** played their final live commercial concert at Candlestick Park in San Francisco. John Lennon and Paul McCartney even brought cameras on stage to commemorate the end of their touring era.

August 30, 1965: At the **Forest Hills Music Festival** in New York, Bob Dylan caused a massive stir when he plugged in an electric guitar, officially transitioning to rock and upsetting traditional folk purists.

August 4, 1958: *Billboard* combined its individual charts into one master list, establishing the **Billboard Hot 100**. Ricky Nelson's "Poor Little Fool" became the very first #1 song on the new chart.

August 4, 1901: The legendary jazz trumpeter and singer Louis Armstrong was born in New Orleans, Louisiana.

August 29, 1920: The pioneer of bebop and virtuoso saxophonist Charlie Parker was born in Kansas City, Kansas.

August 29, 1958: Michael Jackson (The King of Pop) was born in Gary, Indiana.



Iconic Music History That was Made in the Month of August

The month of August holds the single most critical milestone of Benny Goodman's career. On August 21, 1935, Benny Goodman and His Orchestra played a legendary concert at the Palomar Ballroom in Los Angeles, an event widely recognized by jazz historians as the official birth of the Swing Era. Prior to August 1935, Goodman's cross-country tour had been highly unsuccessful, meeting cold receptions in the Midwest. Expecting another failure at the Palomar Ballroom on August 21, Goodman decided to stop playing safe stock arrangements and instead told his band to play their hard-driving, syncopated Fletcher Henderson charts full out. The Response? The massive crowd of young dancers went wild, surrounding the bandstand!

Exactly one year after his Palomar breakthrough, Goodman made jazz history again in August 1936 by officially forming the Benny Goodman Quartet. He added African American virtuoso Lionel Hampton on vibraphone to his existing trio (which featured Gene Krupa and Teddy Wilson). This creation stood as a revolutionary, high-profile step toward breaking down racial segregation within the American music industry.

Throughout the 1930s and 1940s, Goodman's orchestra became the pinnacle of Swing. While the "King of Swing" is primarily celebrated for his clarinet artistry, his specially selected vocalists gave his swinging instrumentals a romantic and relatable human voice.

Goodman relied on a rotating ensemble of legendary vocalists to perform his orchestra's major hits. Key singers included Helen Ward, Martha Tilton, and Peggy Lee, who helped define the big band era with chart-topper hits like "And the Angels Sing" and "Why Don't You Do Right".

Helen Ward was the primary vocalist who performed with Goodman and his Orchestra that night during their historic, career-launching engagement at the Palomar Ballroom on August 21, 1935. Her swinging vocal performances were a key part of the band's energetic live set that helped ignite the Swing Era.



Benny Goodman died of an apparent heart attack (heart failure) on June 13, 1986, at his Manhattan apartment in New York City. The legendary "King of Swing" and clarinet virtuoso was 77 years old at the time of his passing.

USE VISIUL REMINDERS - Whiteboards, calendars, and notes can help reinforce the answer.

REASSURE, THEN REDIRECT. Answer briefly then move to another activity.

LOOK FOR UNMET NEEDS - Fatigue, pain, and boredom can increase repetition.

Remember THE 3 R's

1. **REASSURE** - Let them know they are safe and cared for.
2. **RESPOND** - Answer with kindness and keep it simple and calm.
3. **REDIRECT** - Gently shift attention to another activity or topic.

BOOK CLUB

If you are a reader who likes psychological thrillers, I have a good suggestion for you. *The Silent Patient* written by Alex Michaelides is a page turner. The main character is Theo Faber, a psychoanalyst who becomes extremely interested in a case where a well-known artist, Alicia Berensen, was found guilty of murdering her husband, Gabriel, by shooting him five times in the face and never speaks another word. She is sentenced to life in a mental facility. After several years Theo ends up in that hospital and becomes the doctor treating her and trying to get her to speak. It is easy to say he becomes obsessed with treating her and making her talk. The twists and turns in the plot made me feel that the good characters in this book are few and far between as almost everyone has a secret to hide or some kind of hidden agenda. Our group rated it 3.75 out of five with a high score of 4.5 and a low of 3. There is a copy in the clubhouse library if you would like to read it.

Our choice for August is *The Shack* by William Paul Young. The story of a young girl who is abducted on a vacation to the Oregon wilderness and what happens when her father returns to that same place four years later. *The Shack* is not only a bestselling book but was made into a movie that you can watch on Netflix.

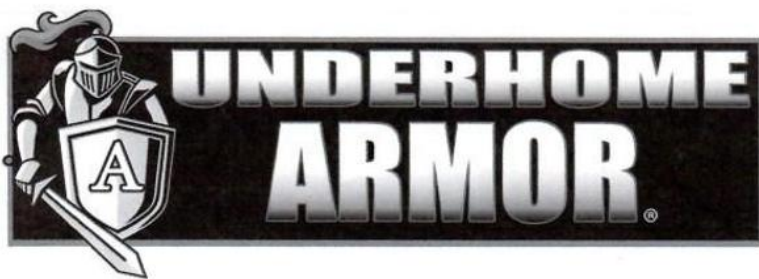
